The children will be assessed using the Reception Baseline Assessment and will begin learning phonics following the Read, Write, Inc programme.

The children will learn to recognise the sounds in

words.

They will learn to form letters correctly and write their name. We will be drawing and making marks and they will be encouraged to share the meaning of their marks.

Mathematics

FOCUS: Number. Numerical Patterns

This term the children will use their knowledge of numbers and number system to 10 and then 20 through playing games and to solving problems.

They will gain an understanding that anything can be counted including steps, stairs and jumps. They will make groups of objects, for example, sorting different fruits and sharing them equally amongst friends.

The children will be encouraged to represent numbers using marks. For example, candles on a birthday cake or how many jumps their friends can

PRIME AREAS

Communication & Language

FOCUS: Listening, Attention & Understanding

The development of children's spoken language is vital in all seven area of your child's learning development. Conversation with adults and peers throughout the day is so important. Through imaginary play, story-telling role play rhymes and poems children will be encourage to share their personal experiences and communicate their ideas in full sentences. We will support this through adult modelling by repeating the child's answer in a full sentence. We will share books and talk to your child about their day and experiences.

Personal, Social & Emotional Development

FOCUS: Self Regulation, Managing Self, Building Relationships Health and wellbeing, including (SRE)

At the beginning of term the children will be making new friends and becoming familiar with their new environment and will be introduced to our golden values and rules. They will develop skills to play co-operatively with others. They will develop their awareness of how to keep safe in and out of the school. A really part of a reception child's development is a growth mindset and creating an environment where children feel comfortable to challenge themselves, take risks and are not scared of marking 'learning' mistakes.

They will be encouraged to talk about a good diet and how to exercise and learn to brush their teeth.







Physical Development

FOCUS: Gross Motor Skills, Fine Motor Skills

Fine Motor

The children will be encouraged to use a range of writing tools and use the tri-grip to mark make. They will learn to thread beads and use tweezers to pick up small objects. They will be able to dress themselves whenever possible, for example zipping coats up and putting on their shoes or aprons.

Gross Motor

The children will develop their ability to negotiate space when moving around at different speeds and using a range of equipment, for example, low movements and high movements.





SPECIFIC AREAS

Literacy

FOCUS: Comprehension, Word Reading, Writing

The children will continue to share a wide range of non-fiction and fiction text including rhymes. They will listen to books about different celebrations They will continue to mark make using a variety of media including paint, pastels and sand and use a variety of media such as paper, pens, pencils to write for a purpose in different areas of the classroom and outdoor and also outdoors.

Mathematics

FOCUS: Number, Numerical Patterns

Children will subitise different arrangements. They will develop the language of 'whole' when talking about objects which have parts.

They will explore the compositions of numbers within 5 and compare sets of objects and use the language of comparison.

They will learn the names and properties of 3D and 2D shapes.
