Phonics?

Synthetic Phonics is a way of teaching reading. It focuses on the use of pure sounds.

Children are taught to read letters or groups of letters by saying the sound(s) they represent - so, they are taught that the letter s sounds like s when we say it.


Children can then start to read words by blending the sounds together to make a word.

We use a systematic synthetic phonics scheme called "Bug Club Phonics".



Phonics Terminology

Phoneme - A phoneme is the smallest unit of sound in a word.




A phoneme is the of sound letter.

Phonics Terminology



Grapheme - A grapheme is a letter or group of letters representing a sound.

Grapheme

A grapheme can be a letter or group of letters. It/they represent a phoneme (sound).


The sound (phoneme is):



It has two letters: s and h. The grapheme is sh

Digraph - This is when two letters come together to make a phoneme. E.g ch for chip sh/for

shop






Trigraph - This is when three letters come together to make one phoneme.
For example:
Air for hair.




Split digraph - A split digraph is when a sound of two letters are split by a consonant.





Two last terms to talk through:

Segmenting - Consists of breaking words down into phonemes to spell.



Blending - Merging the individual phonemes together to read a word.

- Phonics Play website has lots of games and activities. Also Fast Phonics through Reading Eggs




· Being phoneme "detectives".

Phonics Screening Check

Children in Year I throughout the country will all be taking part in a phonics screening check during the same week in June (Week of June 10th). Children in Year 2 will also take the check if they did not achieve the required result when in Year I or they have not taken the test before.





The test contains 40 words. Each child will sit one-to-one and read each word aloud to a teacher. The test will take approximately 10 minutes per child, although all children are different and will complete the check at their own pace. The list of words the children read is a combination of 20 real words and 20 pseudo words (nonsense words).

Parents will be informed if their child has passed at the end of the academic year.
