<p>Pupils have access to a broad and balanced curriculum that is developmentally appropriate and meets the needs of all pupils.</p> <p>Increased participation in competitive sport both in and outside of school</p> <p>Confidence in swimming as a result of additional provision</p>	<p>Our scheme of work (Merton PE) is designed to cover the key elements of the National Curriculum at each stage. Our swimming lessons in Y3 and Y4 ensure coverage in this area.</p> <p>Attendance to inter-school competitions has increased from the previous academic year. Be Active coaches have run a series of intra-school competitions to extend the practice of competitive sport in to all year groups.</p> <p>Pupil interviews demonstrate a positive impact of swimming lessons in Y3 and 4 and increased confidence in pupils.</p>	<p>Levels of activity outside of PE lessons are below desired standards. Some activities such as Daily Mile have limited engagement during winter months. Playground activities require more variety.</p> <p>Some units of work (i.e. OAA) need further revision and adaptation to provide enough variety in KS2</p>	<p>Pupil interviews and staff survey show opportunity for improvement in this area.</p> <p>Planning scrutiny indicate the need to adapt some of our existing planning.</p>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To maintain the Gold award for the School's Game Mark • To further raise the profile of healthy living in order to increase levels of activity and tackle childhood obesity • To help the school in widening opportunities within house system for pupils 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Subscription to HSSP package to enable the school to enter all primary Harrow competitions. Use of Be Active coaches to train pupils to prepare for such competitions. • Delivery of intra-school competitions in Y1-6 with a focus on house team system and promotion of school values through the practice of sport. • Delivery of staff training to increase opportunities to be active outside of PE lessons. Tracking of levels of activity in KS2 and introduction of competition with reward to the most active class in each year group. Increase of number of activities available (i.e. speed stacks, skipping). • Sports Leaders and Be Active staff contribute regularly to provide activities in the playground. • After school clubs and other local initiatives are pushed to use/attend outside of school • Olympian or sports personality to visit school • Organisation of weekly competitions in KS2 with house point reward initiative • House points reward in intra school competitions

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The school continues to be an active participant in Harrow competitions. More pupils are regularly trained to attend these events. • Intra-school competitions take place in Y1-6 linking to sports/games they have been practicing in PE. • Classes incorporate active breaks to their routine with a minimum commitment of 15min every week, aiming to extend this to their daily practice. • Pupils have a variety of activities to choose from in the KS1 and KS2 playgrounds, led by Sports Leaders and supervised by Be Active coaches. • More pupils attending after school clubs. Funding is used to promote equal access to sport and target selected disadvantaged groups. • The profile of sport and PE continues to be raised through workshops and inspirational visits • SGM Gold status being awarded for another year 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Attendance to HSSP competitions and trip registers shows participation in line with previous academic years. • Record of intra-school competitions to show at least one competition held each half term. • Weekly tracking of active minutes in KS2 to show an increase in minutes of activity in students. Pupil interviews show these activities are taking place, showing the impact of the CPD session ran in the Autumn term. • Active registers in KS2 show majority of pupils being active in the playground. • Feedback from school visits and workshops.

Actual impact/sustainability and supporting evidence

What impact/sustainability have you seen?	What evidence do you have?
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Number of competitions attended slightly lower than the previous year, but Elmgrove remains a regular participant in HSSP competitions. • Some intra-school competitions had to be rescheduled due to adverse weather or space availability, but all year groups took part in at least one event. • SL continue to deliver lunchtime activities for both KS1 and KS2, also supporting in other events (i.e. Sports Day). Be Active delivers training for our SL as well as supervising these activities. Weekly house competitions had a positive reception in the first term but participation declined in numbers over time. • Most KS2 classes still engaging in some active breaks and weekly trophy given in assembly has had a positive impact. Teachers now don't need to have an allocated 15min break on their timetable as this seems more embedded in classroom practice. • Average of 110-120 pupils attending after sports clubs each half term plus Y6 boys and girls football teams (20 pupils each approx.). Y5 pupils have had football trials and teams have started training looking ahead of next academic year. • Dan The Skipping Man workshop and assembly for Y1-6 was well received and there was an increased number of pupils skipping at lunchtime. Pupils are now able to purchase their own skipping rope to use in the playground. • Visit from wheelchair basketball player from London Titans and Team GB wheelchair tennis player Andy Lapthorne 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Gold SGM application awaiting verification • Participation in boys/girls football leagues and cups, netball league, tag rugby (qualified for west London finals) and athletics. Could not attend cross country competition. • Intra-school competitions delivered with focus on school values and house competition. Positive feedback from students. Competitions delivered: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Dodgeball – Y1-6 - Football – Y3, 5 - Netball – Y5 - Tennis – Y5 - Basketball – Y4 - Tag rugby – Y4 • Most pupils are active in both playgrounds, with many taking part in structured activities, with active registers in KS2 collecting pupil feedback corroborating this. Activities led by Be Active coaches continue being very popular and children regularly give feedback on games they would like to play. Pupil interviews show pupils are pleased with the choice of activities in the playground. • Records show the weekly competition has had a positive impact in KS2, with most classes averaging 20-40 weekly active minutes. • Positive staff and pupil feedback from the visits of both athletes who found the visits inspirational. Pupils with a physical disability were able to play tennis with Andy Lapthorne and one is currently taking part in wheelchair basketball team.
